Featured Artifact

A prize museum artifact is a US Model 1857 "Napoleon" (named after French Emperor Napoleon III) artillery piece, carriage in any New Jersey museum. a type widely used in the Civil War. Main Museum The cast bronze smoothbore cannon National Guard Training Center features a 4.62 inch bore and fired a 12 pound cannon ball to a range of over 1,600 yards.
